Budget Status 2012-2013


- Every department and unit in the college is out of debt
- \$3,680,772 in operating funds in the department's and units right now
- 30% reduction in computing tax has been maintained and will be greater next year
- \$12,580,345 in Base Funding
- <u>\$24,852,844 in Total Revenue</u>




