 - \$25 late processing fee if application is submitted after the deadline. Late applications can not be submitted through CIS and the application must be turned into the Graduation Division.
 - *Please be aware the Graduation Division will evaluate your record for any duplicate or repeated courses. You will not receive additional credit for repeated course (some exceptions apply) and any duplicate/repeated credits will be removed from your record. Between two U of U repeated courses, the most recent course, not the highest grade, will count for credit. Between two duplicate courses from U of U and another institution, the U of U course that will count for credit regardless of term or grade.*
